Earl, Alma

- Office Manager of the Utah Power and Light Office in 1941.

Earl, Jennie

- Charter Member of the Athenian Club in 1909.

East, Henry

- Henry East was born on 28 June 1872 in Whaddon, Cambridgeshire, England. His parents were George and Rhoda East.
- Henry East was appointed Marshall at the resignation of Marshal Butt.
- Lehi City Marshal 1901-1903; 1908-11
- Utah County Sheriff 1913-1918
- One of the Problems he faced in 1909 was dealing with problems in the night time from unchaperoned youth.
- Had a battle with Nels Otterson at the Elk Saloon. He shot Nels and the bullet went clear through him and he lived. Lehi City Council commended him for standing up to Nels.
- He led on the largest manhunts in Utah for Valdez and his murder of Lopez.
- Marshall East was kept busy with Prohibition. One of the secret places he took down was the Blind Pig which was in the former Elk Saloon Building. It was located at 106 West Main.
- Marshal Henry East had attempted murder on him on December 5, 1902. Edward Meyers was arraigned for the murder.
- Lehi Fire Chief 1902-1903
- He was a Special Agent for the Utah Fuel Company.
- One of the Founders of the short lived Socialist Party in Lehi 1901. It took Elections away from the Lehi Republican Party in 1903.
- He went on to become the Provo Chief of Police.
- Henry East had two wives. Catherine Bestelmeyer East from Provo and Anne Karren East from Lehi.
- He died in 1939. He was buried in Provo by his wife Catherine. His wife

Anne was buried in the Lehi Cemetery.

Eastmond, Frank H.

- Purchased and Operated Saratoga in 1930 until he had a stroke in 1953.

Eastmond, Mick

- Owned with his brothers Saratoga 1953-1963
- Owner/Operator of Saratoga from 1963
- Expanded Saratoga with midway and amusement rides.
- Survived a devastating \$100,000 fire.
- Expanded pools to include slides.
- Donated the slide from Saratoga to the Lehi Outdoor Swimming Pool.

Eckersley, Beverly

- Charter Member of the Serimpian Club 1949

Eckersley, Lorenzo

- Lehi City Judge 1963-66

Eddington, Elmo Dr.

- Born March 19, 1895 in Morgan
- Graduated from Latter-Day Saint High School in Salt Lake
- Graduated from the University of Utah with a Bachelors of Science
- Served in the Medical Corps of the Navy during World War I.
- In 1922 he married Rhea Felt.
- Graduated from the University of Pennsylvania Medical School in 1924
- Began his Doctor career in Chicago Illinois.
- In 1931 he purchased the Lehi Hospital and the practice of Dr. F. W. Worlton in Lehi.
- He delivered hundred of babies in Lehi. People would come from all over to have him as their doctor.
- Has served several times as member of the House of Delegates; Utah State Medical Society and also the American Medical Association throughout his entire practice.
- Past President of the Lehi Lions Club
- Past President of the Lehi Riding Club
- Director of the State Bank of Lehi
- Vice-President of Eddington Canning Company.

- Charter Trustee Member of the John Hutchings Museum 1956
- Turned over the Lehi Hospital to the City so they could obtain Federal Funds for the Hospital.
- Led the successful campaign for Sewer in Lehi with Mayor Frank Sharp.
- He also worked for the Utah State Training School in American Fork.
- He died on the 23 August, 1962.

Eddington, Rhea Felt

- Attended the Manti Elementary, Manti and Moroni High schools, Agricultural College of Logan and the University of Utah.
- She is past President of the Auxiliary to the Utah County Medical Society.
- She has served as secretary to the Utah State Medical Auxiliary.
- On September 15, 1922, she married Elmo Eddington
- Mother of three children.

Eddington, Richard Hale

- Born May 11, 1926 in Lehi.
- Lehi Second Ward Bishop 1983-1987

Edwards, Arley

- Ran a Barber shop at 60 West Main from 1951-52

Edwards, Edward William

- Member of the First Mormon Handcart Company. Edmund Ellsworth was the Captain. Arrived September 26, 1856
- Worked at Camp Floyd as a Tailor for the soldiers.
- Shot in the leg by a drunken Camp Floyd soldier.
- Moved to Lehi in 1859
- Was assistant choir director in Lehi for many years.
- Member of the First Lehi Choir in 1852
- Led an expedition to White Mountains in Nevada to explore as a Mormon settlement.
- Member of the 68th Quorum of the Seventy

Edwards, Frank W.

- Born in Mississippi in 1892
- Enlisted in the Infantry, 91st Division.
- He became a casualty of World War I on October 26, 1918. Died of wounds

in France.

Edward, Wayne L.

- Lehi Fourth Ward Bishop 1988-1989

Ekins, Abel

- Worked in Hawaii at Pearl Harbor at the time of the attack during World War II.
- Purchased Lehi Drug Store from his father-in-law Gerald Taylor in January 1959.
- Owner of the Lehi Drug Store and pharmacist
- Grand Marshal Lehi Roundup 1998

Ekins, Dale

- Lehi City Fire Chief 1995-Current
- Lehi Businessman-Lehi Drug and Pioneer Party and Copy
- Lehi High School Hall of Fame 2013

Ekins, Geraldine Taylor

- Artist
- Founding Member of the Lehi Serimpian Club in 1949. Still a member in 2014
- Captain of the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers
- Worked at Pearl Harbor at the time of the attack during World War II.
- Grand Marshal Lehi Roundup 1998
- Honored as a Lehi Walk of Fame Honoree in 2014.

Ellingson, David

- Original Owner of Lehi Drug Store.
- He died in 1897

Ellingson, Oley

- Built a home on the west side of the Old Lehi Fort in 1854.
- Part of the Lehi Militia called to defend Fort Limhi against the Indians March 8, 1858
- City Hall Building Committee 1877
- Served as City Treasurer 1867-68; 1875-77.
- Served as City Councilor 1867-74; 1877;1891-93; 1896-97
- Served three terms as Mayor. The first two he was elected on the People's

party.

- Was the first Republican Mayor of Lehi in 1894-95.
- As a monogamist, he helped provide leadership at a time when other men of prominence were in jail or in hiding.
- Served on the Board of Directors of the Lehi Irrigation Company.
- Mayor Ellingson directed the Lehi City Quarantine Board during the Diphtheria epidemic in 1885.
- Founder of the Lehi Commercial and Savings Bank in 1891.
- Married Abigail Evans, daughter of David Evans.
- Died in Lehi in 1903

Ellingson, Oley Jr.

- Lehi City Treasurer 1894-95

Ellison, Arthur Earl (Bud)

- 39th Mayor of Lehi 1982
- Born in Nephi.
- Served in the Navy as Chief Petty Officer during World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War.
- Traveled the World
- Engineer
- Member American Society of Civil Engineers
- Member American Society of Mechanical Engineers
- Member Society of Mining Engineers
- Worked for the Intermountain Power Agency
- Married Anna June Southwick of Lehi in 1975.
- Moved to Lehi in 1975.
- Resigned Mayor after 195 days. Cited conflict of Interest.
- He ran again as mayor and lost in 1985.
- Later years spent the winters in St. George and the Summers in Lehi.

Ellison, Harold

- Purchased the Fashion Cleaners from Clyde McKay with Alvin Folkerson in December 1947. (101 West Main).
- Ran Ellison Cleaners from 1947-1971. It was also known as Lehi Cleaners.
- Author of several section in the 1850-1950 Centennial History

- Member of the Jaycees Organization.

Engstrom, Chad

- Purchased the Ross Schoolhouse in 1893 and restored the building.

Enough, Abraham

- He was born about 1808 in St Jean, Jersey Island, Channel Island, England.
- His name is really spelled Esnouf
- He emigrated in 1855 (see resource for immigration) and came to Utah Territory in Charles A Harper Company.
- He had two of his children with him Thomas (born in 1836) and Elizabeth (born 1832 and died in 1905).
- He is found in the 1860, 1870, and 1880 census living in Lehi, Utah, Utah Territory.
- Entered a contract with Robert Gilchrist to make adobes for him.
- Gilchrist allowed Enough to work for Woodhouse. For this Woodhouse made Gilchrist and his brother each a pair of pants.
- “A portly little Frenchman”.
- Organized and Directed the First Band in Lehi-The Fife and Drum Company in 1860.
- Played the Fife in the Band.
- Was the Mason for the City Hall on Main Street in 1872.
- Played the Bass violin in many early bands.

Erickson, George Henry

- Born July 8, 1884, in Koosharem, Utah,
- Moved to Lehi in 1899 to live at his uncle’s home, Mr. and Mrs. Charles A. Ohran.
- On September 14, 1911, he married Myrtle Bone in the Salt Lake Temple.
- He later attended Brigham Young University at Provo.
- While at the Ohran home he learned the brick mason trade at which he spent a good portion of his life.
- He filled a mission for the Church in the Southern States from 1907-1910.
- He was Ward Clerk of the Lehi First Ward from 1913 to 1916
- Served as Bishop of the Lehi Fifth Ward 1928-1937
- He personally supervised the construction of the Fifth Ward Chapel, and it

was built, paid for and dedicated while he was Bishop.

- The latter years of his life he worked for the Utah-Idaho Sugar Company, doing repair work on their factories.
- He died on July 20, 1944.

Erickson, Myrtle Bone

- On September 14, 1911, he married Myrtle Bone in the Salt Lake Temple.
- Mother of Seven Children

Ernst, Klea

- Member of the Lehi Olympian Club

Evans, Abel

- Abel was born in Llamblidy, county of Carmarthen, South Wales, June 17, 1812.
- He was baptized that night February 10, 1844. he was believed to be the second person baptized in Wales.
- Family settled in Lehi in 1852, emigrating from Wales.
- While on this voyage he courted Mary Jones. They were married after they arrived in America. Abel was 37 and Mary was 22.
- Served as a Counselor to Bishop David Evans in the Lehi Ward
- Supervised the Adobe Pit and the adobe brick production for the Lehi Meeting House with William W. Taylor and William B. Rigby 1855-60.
- Constructed the Adobe on the Meeting House
- Had a house on the north side of the Lehi Fort Wall.
- Was one of the Original Lawmen associated with the Fort Wall.
- Lehi City Marshal 1863-66
- Served as Lehi City Councilor 1854-55; 1859-60
- Abel had three wives in Lehi.
- Died on a mission to Wales in 1865

Evans, Abel John

- High Council Utah Stake (Met at Provo Tabernacle-included Lehi)
- Second Counselor Alpine Stake Presidency 1901-1920
- Lehi Stake Patriarch from 1928 until his death.
- Taught Civil Government classes in the 1880-1890. Class members became the leaders in Politics, Education and Business.

- Lehi's 13th Mayor 1891-93; First Mayor born in Lehi. First Democratic Mayor.
- Lehi City Alderman 1883-88
- Lehi City Councilor 1880-82
- Lehi City Attorney 1908-1911; 1914-1917; 1928-33
- Ran his Law office from the Lehi Commercial and Savings Bank Building.
- Served on the Utah County Court 1892-96.
- Served four terms in the Utah State Legislature-the first four after Statehood.
- Introduced the famous Evans Polygamy Bill which would have legalized polygamy in Utah but was vetoed by Governor Wells.
- President of the Utah Senate last term.
- Self Educated-Admitted to the State Bar in 1901.
- Legal advisor for the Alpine School Board, the People's Co-op, the Provo Reservoir Company, and the Utah Lake Irrigation Company.
- Director Utah Lake Distributing Company.
- Director People's Bank of Lehi, Bank of American Fork, the Bank of Lehi, the Inter-Mountain Life Insurance Company of Salt Lake City, Provo Woolen Mills, and the Utah Idaho Sugar Company.
- Promoter of the Salt Lake and Utah Electric Railroad Company (Orem Interurban).
- President of the Lehi United Order of Enoch 1874-1880

Evans, Alva

- Grand Marshal Lehi Roundup 1993

Evans, Barbara Ann Bush

- Served in the first Relief Society Presidency for 11 years.
- Gifted Quilter and spun yarn even on the way across the plains.
- Her family was converted at Shoal Creek in Missouri by Elder David Evans
- Married David Evans in Nauvoo.
- Saw all the trials in Nauvoo and saw the bodies of Joseph Smith and Hyrum Smith.
- Supported her husband David through all his responsibilities

Evans, Bill (William)

- Bill opened a dance studio in the Comer Building at 116 West Main Street

from 1961-63.

- World Famous dancer

Evans, Carole

- Charter Member of the Letitian Club 1952

Evans, Charles D.

- Lehi City Councilor 1863-1865

Evans, Connie

- Charter Member of the Letitian Club 1952

Evans, David

- First Judge of Election 1853
- Elected First Alderman of Lehi 1853-54
- Member of Zion's Camp 1834
- Branch President of Crooked River, Missouri 1834
- Ordained in the First Quorum of the Seventy by Joseph Smith 1835
- Attended the School of the Prophets 1835-36
- Militia Captain and Religious Leader at Hauns Mill 1838
- Bishop of the Nauvoo 11th Ward
- Family settled in Lehi in 1851
- Lehi's First Bishop (Dry Creek and Lehi Ward) for 28 years
- Established the First Tithing Office and yard at 344 West Main.
- Directed the planning of the United States Centennial Celebration in Lehi in 1876.
- Second Mayor of Lehi 1854-1861
- Served as President of the Union Exchange. Helped his son Israel get the first Co-operative going in Lehi.
- First member of the Utah Territory Legislator representing Utah County 1851 Served several terms in the Legislature.
- First Postmaster of Lehi.
- Chairman of the Lehi Fort Committee created Feb. 17, 1854
- Built a home on the North side of the Old Lehi Fort in 1854
- Imported with Thomas Karren and David Collett first Threshing Machine to Lehi summer 1854
- Second Innkeeper in Lehi.

- Obtained Sugar Beet Seeds from John Taylor for the citizens of Lehi Spring of 1852.
- Called by Brigham Young to accompany him to investigate possible areas to settle in Idaho April 1857.

Evans, David Jr.

- Taught School at the Franklin School
- Went and studied Law
- Lehi City Attorney 1877-80
- Delegate to the Democratic National Convention for the nomination of William Jennings Bryan in 1896
- Became US Deputy Marshal
- Asst. US District Attorney 1887-1891
- Elected to the State Legislature in 1895
- Was a member of the State Legislative Constitutional Convention.
- Moved to California and became attorney in Los Angeles.

Evans, Donna

- Charter Member of the Serimpian Club 1949

Evans, Dorothy

- Founding Member of the Lehi Liahonian Club.
- Charter Member of the Letitian Club 1952

Evans, Duane

- Director of the Civic Improvement Association 1964 and 1972-88
- Grand Marshal Lehi Roundup 1993

Evans, Edna

- Member of the Olympian Club

Evans, Edward

- Lehi City Councilor 1894-95

Evans, Edwin

- Lehi City Recorder 1885-86
- Lehi City Alderman 1889-90
- Painted the first Lehi Silver Bandwagon with Like-like nude mermaids causing a stir in the Lehi Community in 1895
- Resigned City Alderman to study art in Europe. Spring of 1890

- Studied art in France from 1890-1895
- Becomes Professor of Art at the University of Utah

Evans, Emma Frederica Southwick

- Born in Lehi in 1867
- Sang vocal duets with her sister
- Married Morgan Evans in 1890
- Member and worker for the Service Star Legion
- Prided in sewing temple clothes.
- Died 1929

Evans, Ferd

- Opened the Evans Cafe at 120 West Main in December 1945.
- Purchased the Comer Building at 116 West Main in 1946
- Expanded their cafe kitchens next door and made some business rentals.
- In 1959 turned over the business to Alta Clark.
- They closed Evans Cafe forever in 1961.

Evans, F. L.

- Lehi City Recorder 1936-37

Evans, George

- Lehi City Judge 1894-95
- Lehi City Marshal 1906-1908 Died while in office.

Evans, Hyrum J.

- Lehi City Marshal 1924-27

Evans, Irene

- Member Lehi Liahonian Club

Evans, Israel

- Israel Evans was born in Hanover, Columbus County, Ohio, October 2, 1828, his parents being David and Mary Beck Evans.
- Lehi Resident who served in the Mormon Battalion 1846-47
- He arrived in Salt Lake City October 1, 1848 and was married January 1, 1849 to Matilda A. Thomas.
- Member of the first settlement of Lehi at Sulphur Springs Winter 1850-51
- Part of the Lehi Militia called to defend Fort Limhi against the Indians March 8, 1858 Was named a Major.

- Worked at Sutter's Mill when the gold was discovered.
- Built a home on the North side of the Old Lehi Fort in 1854
- Surveyor of farms, towns, irrigation ditches and other items.
- Elected First City Counselor 1853-54; also in 1863-66
- Served as Lehi City Alderman 1859-60; 1869-74
- Served as the 6th Lehi Mayor 1867-68
- Member of the First Lehi Library Association 1865
- Came up with idea of a Cooperative from touring one on his mission to England.
- Israel Evans with the help of his father set up the Lehi Union Exchange in early 1868.
- Director of the Union Exchange.
- Built a building on 181-189 West Main to the Lehi Union Exchange.
- ZCMI was based on the Lehi Union Exchange.
- Brigham Young paid tribute to the Union Exchange in General Conference on April 1869.
- The People's Cooperative put the Union Exchange out of business in 1880.
- Israel sold the business to the People's Cooperative in 1880.
- As Alderman, Israel Evans led the building of a new Cemetery in 1871 with sexton George W. Thurmond.
- He was also appointed major in the local division of the territorial militia.
- As a state Legislator, he pursued legislation to establish the Brigham Young Agricultural College (Utah State University) which was passed.
- He was instrumental in the location of the sugar factory at Lehi, maintaining and proving the suitability of the proposed site, in spite of discouraging conditions.
- He died May 31, 1896, in Lehi, respected by all who knew him.

- Alpine School Board Member 1987-1994

Evans, John S.

- Lehi City Marshal 1914-15; 1920-21

Evans, Lila

- Member of the Lehi Liahonian club

Evans, Lois

- Member of the Lehi Olympian Club.

Evans, Lucile

- Charter Member of the Letitian Club 1952

Evans, Matilda Thomas

- Member of the first settlement of Lehi at Sulphur Springs Winter 1850-51
- Early her husband was called on a mission leaving her destitute.
- Would go into the fields and glean wheat to feed her family
- Did most of the building on her home in the Lehi Fort while her husband was on a mission.

Evans, Mary Jones

- Came to Lehi in 1852.
- Known for her hospitality and cheerfulness

Evans, Morgan

- Born in 1863
- Successful Farmer
- He married Emma F. Southwick, a daughter of William and Savina Larson Southwick, January 29, 1890, in Salt Lake City.
- Lehi City Marshal 1912 (died in Office).
- Member of Lehi's First Baseball Team
- President of Lehi Irrigation Company in 1895.
- Founder and President of the Lehi Commercial Club
- Manager of the Dance Hall.
- Served four Terms on the Lehi School Board
- Served on the Alpine School District Board
- Served as Deputy Game Commissioner
- Director of the Local Farmers Organization
- Chairman of the Lehi Republican Party
- Directors of the State Bank of Lehi
- He died April 26, 1912. The day of his funeral the school doors were closed and the flag hung at half mast in respect to his work and memory.

Evans, Morgan

- Lehi Student Body President 1955

Evans, Mosiah

- Was born the early evening of 22 September 1862 in the two story adobe family home facing South on Main Street in Lehi.
- Had twinkling dark brown eyes, a characteristic of the majority of his father's children marked him as one of those "Evans papooses" as the Indians designated them. His hair was also brown and from wavy to curly depending on the weather. His complexion was fair.
- Respected telegrapher for the Union Pacific Railroad 1882-1892
- Bookkeeper and Accountant for the People's Cooperative
- Established a Notary Public business in the Lehi Commercial and Savings Bank. in 1894.
- Lehi City Recorder 1894-95
- Lehi City 14th Mayor 1896-97 and 1900.
- Lost the Mayorship over his opposition to Prohibition.
- First Partisan Mayoral election in Lehi
- Elected to the State Legislature in 1900. Resigned his second term as Mayor.
- Mayor at the time Utah became a State.
- Erected an 80 foot pole on the jail lot to hoist a large flag with 45 stars to commemorate the statehood of Utah.
- In 1904 moved to Garland working for the new Utah-Idaho Sugar Company.
- First president Garland town board 1905, and Garland Commercial Club 1907 and 1912; president Bank of Garland and the athletic association; resident manager Utah-Idaho Sugar company.
- In 1916 moved to Spanish Fork working for the Sugar Company.
- Died Tragically in Salt Lake City in 1921..

- Lehi City Attorney 1891-92, 1899-1900
- Lehi City Treasurer 1892-93
- Died while serving as attorney in 1900.

Evans, Ruel

- American Legion Committee to Build Veterans Ballpark 1952

Evans, Sarah T.

- Lehi City Recorder 1901-1902

Evans, Sylvester

- Lehi City Councilmember 1938-43
- Lehi City Judge 1946-50

Evans, William A. (Bill)

- Purchased the Senate Building in 1934. It was at 169 West Main Street
- He established the Lehi Billiard Parlor.
- Became known as the Lehi Pool Hall or Bills Place
- Retired at the age of 80 in 1965.0

Evans, William Samuel

- Born in Lehi in 1855
- In 1874 he married Geneva Clark.
- In 1893-94 Committee member for the North Branch Meeting House at 500 West and 1200 North.
- Lehi City Councilor 1891-1893; 1914-17
- One of the Founders of the short lived Socialist Party in Lehi 1901
- Built a home in Lehi in 1900 at 4th North and 2 West.
- President of the First Elders Quorum in Lehi
- Served two years on the Lehi Irrigation Board
- Served nine years as a member of the Alpine School Board.
- Served two years as the Vice President of Alpine School Board
- Instrumental in the building of the Franklin School, the Primary School, the Grammar School and an extension on the Sego Lily School.
- Died on the November 2, 1935

Eves, Joel

- Lehi Power Department Director-hired in 2013.

Faddis, Roger

- Lehi First Ward Bishop

Farrer, Rickie M.

- Lehi Tenth Ward Bishop 1981-1983

Felt, Rita

- Married Russell Ray Felt

- Parents of three boys
- Longtime Member of the Mormon Tabernacle Choir
- Musical Director and Performer
- Worked at MATC
- Gifted knitter and Hand work sewer

Felt, Richard (Dick) George

- Star Athlete at Lehi High School
- Played for Brigham Young University
- Played in the American Football League on the Patriots and the Titan Teams.
- Assistant Football Coach at Brigham Young University under LaVell Edwards

Felt, Russell Ray

- Lehi 13th Ward Bishop 1982-1986
- Lehi Utah Stake President 1987-
- Lehi Jr. High School Principal 1987-
- Lehi High School Principal 1987-1996
- Lehi High School State Winning Basketball Coach
- President Friends of Camp Floyd
- Bishop LDS Missionary Training Center
- Jordan River Stake Patriarch
- Worked at Alpine School District Headquarters.

Fenn, Harold

- Served in World War II in the Navy
- Worked as the head grinder at Lehi Roller Mills for nearly 40 years.
- Worked also at Geneva Steel.
- Leader in the American Legion for many years.
- Spearheaded the Veterans Memorial up at the Lehi Cemetery.

Ferkovich, Anthony J.

- Lehi City Police Chief 1961-63
- Founding Member of the Lehi Dance Set in 1948. Served as the Co-Chairmen.

Ferkovich, Ardith

- Married Anthony Ferkovich
- Mother of three children.
- Founding Member of the Lehi Dance Set in 1948. Served as the Co-Chairmen.

Fischer, David

- Born of Parents who escaped from East Germany.
- Store Director Maceys in Lehi
- Member of the Mormon Youth Choir.
- Member of the Mormon Tabernacle Choir for years.

Fjeld, Joseph

- Member of the Lehi Dramatic Association in 1854.

Fjeld, Andrew

- Came across to Utah in Stoddart Handcart Company-The last handcart company to come across the plains. 1870
- Pioneer Historian; kept detailed journals.
- Served an LDS mission to Australia. Called to preside over the Mission from 1900-1901
- In 1887 was a charter member of the Lehi Silver Band.
- Served one term on the Lehi School Board
- Lays the last brick of the Lehi Tabernacle. April 11, 1902.
- Served as Bishop of the Lehi First Ward 1903-1920.
- Served as Bishop of the Lehi Fifth Ward 1920-1927
- Lehi City Councilor 1891-92
- Member of the Lehi Pioneer Committee
- Member of the 1913 Lehi History Book Committee
- In 1894 Contractor with Charles Ohran for the North Branch Meetinghouse. Lays rock for the church from the Zions Hill Quarry.

- Member of the first settlement of Lehi at Sulphur Springs Winter 1850-51

Fotheringham, John

- Member of the first settlement of Lehi at Sulphur Springs Winter 1850-51

Fotheringham, William

- William Fotheringham was born on April 5, 1826 at Clackmannan, Scotland,
- Member of the first settlement of Lehi at Sulphur Springs Winter 1850-51. He came to Lehi with his aged Parents.
- He obtained employment in a blacksmith shop and also worked as a carpenter in the construction of the Tithing Office in Salt Lake City.
- In the Spring of 1851, he commenced farming in Lehi.
- He married three women while he was in Lehi. He had 30 children.
- In Spring 1852, he accompanied President Brigham Young and others on an

exploring expedition through Utah, Juab, Sanpete, Millard, Beaver and Iron counties.

- Accompanied Brigham Young to explore the Salmon River to settle.
- Lehi Councilor 1861-resigned after a couple of months.
- Lehi Militia Group called to Echo Canyon later went to Wyoming to help Lott Smith antics.
- Called by Brigham Young to go with him and Bishop David Evans to Idaho to explore areas for possible settlements in Idaho. April 1857
- From 1852-1855, he filled a mission to India, traveling 3,000 miles to the Northwest provinces in a bullock wagon.
- On the first boat wreck on Utah Lake and had to swim to shore. May 1851
- He left Lehi in April 1861 on a mission to South Africa. He was the Mission President from 1861-1864.
- Served for over 40 years as a Sunday School worker.
- At the request of President Brigham Young, he moved to Beaver, Utah in May 1865, to assist John R. Murdock who had been called to be the bishop of Beaver.
- He was called as a Bishop of Beaver in 1877 and later as Patriarch of Beaver Stake.
- In civil offices, he acted as Mayor of Beaver, County and Probate Clerk of Beaver County for a period of 18 years, a justice of the peace of Beaver precinct, and a member of the Utah Territorial Legislature from Beaver, Iron and Piute counties (1879-1880).
- In the year 1877, he helped to construct the first telegraph line between Beaver and the town of Frisco.
- He was a forceful and eloquent speaker, and an interesting writer. His "Travels in India", written by himself, were published and illustrated in the Juvenile Instructor from 1876 to 1884.
- Served a mission to the St. George Temple.
- He served three months (in 1885) in the Utah Penitentiary for polygamy.
- He lived in Milford, Utah, during his last remaining years and died there on February 27, 1913.

- Served for a short period of time as the Lehi Second Ward Scoutmaster.
- Guest speaker at hundreds of functions in Lehi and Utah County events.

- As a young man, he made three trips east to the Missouri River to bring back emigrants.

- He was a gifted musician and gave freely of his time and talents to the community and the church. He was a music teacher, accompanist, soloist and composed several hymns.
- Tutored the members of the Lehi Silver Band each week on their instruments.
- One of the first Organists in Lehi. Played for church meetings in the Lehi Meeting House.
- He was chosen leader of the first Brass Band of Lehi.
- He held the position of choir leader in the Third Ward for many years.
- He also served as president of the Young Men's Mutual Improvement Association in the Third Ward for a number of years.
- His occupation was farming, and music teacher. the latter taking him away from his home much of the time.

- She moved to Lehi in 1911 and there raised her large family and also four children belonging to her son Dewey.

- Conceived and Designed the Jordan River Pumping station-at one time the largest pumps in the world.
- General Manager Utah-Idaho Sugar Company
- Lehi Mayor when Memorial Building was built 1920-21
- Lehi City Council Member 1901-1903
- Utah County Commissioner for six years 1921-1926.
- Elected as a Utah Legislature in 1925.
- Built his home in Lehi which was called the Rose and Green Villa. Dedicated by President Woodruff. It was at 187 East 300 North.
- First Bishop Lehi Second Ward 1903-1917
- Instrumental in the creation of the State Bank of Lehi, State Bank of American Fork, Lehi Roller Mills, the Commercial Club and the Lehi Mercantile.

- Served as President of the Commercial Club
- Served an LDS Mission to the Sandwich Islands (Hawaii) where he was called to work in a Sugar mill which he hated.
- Served on the School Board.

- Built the home at 118 East with her husband.

Garff, Christian

- Lehi Resident who created the Utah County Power and Light Company on August 2, 1899.
- Built the American Fork Canyon hydroelectric Plant in 1900
- Brought Electricity to Lehi in 1900.

Garff, Lauritz (Louis)

- Born in Denmark in 1853
- He emigrated from Denmark with his parents, Niels Jorgen Garff and Marie Jacobsen Garff. He also traveled with his two older brothers, P. N. Garff and Christian Garff, sister Josephine, and a younger brother who had been born aboard the ship on the ocean. His sister and his father died while en route to Utah.
- Louis came to Lehi in 1855,
- His mother married Gudmund Gudmundsen
- His home was the Wing Mortuary. He later sold it to George Robinson.
- Started his first business in Lehi in 1885
- Lehi City Councilman 1891-93

- Built and Operated Lehi Opera House (Garff Hall) 1887 at 154 West Main.
- It was a two story rock building. The Opera House was were more than one foot thick. It was where Pioneer Copy is today.
- Garff Hall was just another name for the Lehi Opera House.
- Opened the Opera House with a large Gala on Christmas Eve 1887. 400 people attended the Opening Gala.
- The Opera House served most of the social needs of Lehi for over two decades.

- 44th Mayor of Lehi 1994-98
- Died in 2013

Gibbons, Richard C.

- Served as Lehi City Councilor 1854-55

Gilchrist, Ione Thurman

- Ione Thurman Gilchrist was born July 30, 1874 at Lehi, Utah the daughter of David J. and Elgiva Evans Thurman.
- She received her education at the New West School, Lehi, Utah receiving a diploma upon graduation.
- At the age of eighteen, she commenced a teaching career in the public schools of Utah. She taught at Eden and Huntsville and for several years at the old Franklin School in Lehi.
- In 1898, she was married to Sydney Gilchrist and became the mother of six children.
- At the outbreak of World War I, she was called back to the school room where she continued to serve until ill health compelled her to resign.

- Ione T. Gilchrist died January 25, 1939, having been a widow of eight years.

Gilchrist, Mary Jane Willes

- Mary Jane Willes Gilchrist was born in Lehi, Utah January 22, 1853, a daughter of William Sidney Smith and Alzina Lucinda Lott Willes.
- She was the oldest of nine children. When she was eighteen, her father died. Her mother having ill health, the burden of the family fell on her shoulders.
- Once in her teens, she had quite an experience with an indian brave. He gave her a bracelet and insisted she put it on and then left. Her father, hearing of the incident and knowing indian customs became alarmed. The indians and her friends returned to claim her as his bride, and much choice food was given to change his mind and make him take back the bracelet.
- Mary Jane married Robert T. Gilchrist October 6, 1874 in the Endowment House. They had seven daughters and three sons, all three sons preceded her in death. She also reared a grandson.
- She was active in church work, taught primary for many years and was Primary President for a time.
- For eighteen years, she was a Relief Society District Teacher and served on the Old Folks Committee.
- She died April 20, 1836 at the age of eighty-four.

Gilchrist, Robert Taylor

- Robert Taylor Gilchrist was born in Ayrshire, Scotland February 3, 1946.
- Robert joined the church in 1854 and came to America in 1861; and later was the driver of a wagon crossing the plains with a freight company. He had many thrilling and terrifying experiences. They found arrow-riddled bodies of many people killed by Indians. They also buried some from their own company who died along the way from sickness and hunger.
- When he settled in Lehi, he started making shoes a trade he learned in Scotland. He walked to Salt Lake and back for his first supplies. With the advance of machinery, he change to carpentering, a trade he followed from then on, together with painting, papering, brick-laying and plastering.
- Robert was a Black hawk War Veteran.
- Member of the first Lehi Bass Band in 1871.
- One of the Founders of the short lived Socialist Party in Lehi 1901.

- October 6, 1874, he married Mary Jane Willes in the Endowment House in Salt Lake. They had ten children: Robert Sidney, John, Alice, Lileth, Zina, Janet, Ada, and Athena
- At the age of seventy-six he climbed to the top of Mount Timpanogos with a group.
- He was still active in mind and body at the time of his passing, in November 1936, at the age of ninety.

Gilchrist, Robert

- Peoples Cooperative Cobbler.
- Lehi City Councilmember 1931.

Gilchrist, Sydney

- He was born in Lehi, Utah, August 2, 1876. He was the son of Robert T. and Mary Jane Willes Gilchrist.
- Lehi's 22nd Mayor of Lehi 1918-1920; 1928-1931
- Lehi City Councilmember 1914-1917; 1922-27
- Went to the New West Academy
- In 1896, he entered the services of the People's Co-operative Store of Lehi. He was with that business institution thirty years, resigning in 1926.
- In 1926 started Gilchrist Hardware.
- Member of the Lehi Volunteer Fire Department
- Appointed to Lehi's first library board in 1917.
- Charter Member of the Lehi Lions club
- Active Member of the Municipal League
- Leader in the efforts to build Deer Creek Reservoir
- Mayor at the time of the approval to build the Memorial Building
- In his church, he was appointed and served six years 1921-27, as President of the Elders Quorum.
- Died from injuries of an automobile accident while in office; passed away January 23, 1931.

Giles, Ernest Afton

- Ernest Afton Giles, son of Heber J. and Susana Witt Giles, was born September 9, 1892, in Heber City, Utah.
- He received his education in the Heber schools.

- He came to Lehi to make his home. He started working for the People's Co-operative Institution in 1919. He worked there until 1938.
- Purchases part of the Peoples Cooperative and forms Giles Feed in 1937.
- Initially used the building at 189 East State and then moved to the building at 197 East State.
- For a number of years, he was a member of the Lehi Lions Club.
- We served on the Lehi Fire Department for many years.
- In 1921, he was asked to be the Scoutmaster of the Second Ward Scouts. He was the Scoutmaster when the first Second Ward Scouts were registered in the Timpanogos Council.
- Later he worked in the Young Men's Mutual Improvement Association presidency and in the Sunday School superintendency of the Second Ward.
- He worked on the genealogical committee and was a ward teacher.
- On September 20, 1920, he married Leona Long in the Salt Lake Temple.

Giles, Dennis

Giles, Leona Long

- Leona Long Giles, daughter of Felix G. and Mary Ellen Sharp Long, was born February 24, 1897, in Lehi, Utah.
- Receiving her education in Lehi, she graduated from High School in 1916.
- Furthering her education, she received her teacher's Normal Diploma from the Brigham Young University.
- She taught in the Lehi Primary School.
- She was active in the Second Ward Primary, teaching when her mother was president, and working in the presidency for eight years. She also served on the Alpine Stake Board and the Lehi Stake Board after the division.
- She was a member of the Athenian Club.
- She was a member of the Garden Club.
- On September 15, 1920, she was married in the Salt Lake Temple to Ernest Afton Giles, of Heber City, Utah. They resided on the same corner lot where she was born.
- She was the mother of two sons, Stanford and Harold Giles.

Gill, Joseph J.

Glynes, John

- Member of the Lehi Militia Group that fought in the Tintic War 1856
- Part of the Lehi Militia called to defend Fort Limhi against the Indians March 8, 1858

Goates, Clara Evans

- Clara Evans Goates, daughter of Bishop David Evans and Margaret Christian Holm, was born December 21, 1876 in Lehi, Utah.
- August 30, 1899, she was married to Joseph Goates, in the Salt Lake Temple and to this union, four children were born; Melba Clara (Mrs. Glen Clark), twin boys (Lorin Wayne and Warren LaMar) and LaPriel (Mrs. Norven W. Brown).
- Because of her ability and love of fine arts, she was able to teach needlecraft in the schools.
- Later she obtained employment at the People's Co-operative Store, where she was very diligent, and trustworthy at all times.
- During the second epidemic of influenza, she died January 30, 1920, at the age of forty-three years.

Goates, George A.

- Lehi City Recorder 1908-1911.
- In 1886, He was the President of the newly organized Lehi Silver Band.
- Charter Member of the Lehi Silver Band in 1887.
